| | Comment period for discussion paper has closed. 10 submissions received. General themes were overall support for framework. DMP recognizes ongoing consultation with industry essential. | |

| | DMP have received advice bonds can only be used for the specific purpose eg the tenement bonded. DMP will look at rehabilitating abandoned sites with bond money but if short will look at MRF funds. | |

| | Steve Tantala gave presentation of how proposed reforms will change format of MPs. Industry consultation expected to commence in July. A range of companies have been targeted for trial, including medium sized. The general public will be consulted by October. Transparency • Concerns rose regarding the public availability of MPs at application stage. DMP are aware of these concerns noting not all these concerns relate to the majority of proposals. DMP are keen to seek bilateral accreditation process which requires public engagement. Risk Based Regulation • Risk-based regulation is a proven effective environmental model. Other states have been using this method for over 10 years. • Peer review may be needed on compliance with standards for particular features, and the guidelines will reflect standards required. • Concerns were raised regarding small operators being priced out of the market due to the requirements. DMP advised that the requirements will be proportional to the environmental risks. • Reporting will be mandatory to report any deviation. • Implementation strategy will be owned by proponent. Will not discriminate against smaller operators. Procedures and Systems • Aims to eliminate the need for multiple approvals for the one site. • System of notification for minor changes will be assisted by electronic lodgment. | |
| | Discussion took place of the difficulties of consistency across government departments. Spatial capture of projects would help this issue. Ability to track all approvals. DMP has target that all regulatory correspondence will be electronic by 1 July 2016. Environment Division are on the way to this goal with Programmes of Work Exploration end to end online by 30 June 2014. AMEC will identify members to be included in the trial. | |
