Discovery trails to early Earth a travellers guide to the east Pilbara of Western Australia

Travel through this iconic ancient land (more than 3 500 000 000 years old) to visit remnants of gigantic volcanic eruptions, ancient sedimentary rocks, the famed Marble Bar, and the most ancient traces of life on Earth, called stromatolites. Six drive trails centred on the township of Marble Bar have stopping points along the way. Each stop has a two-page spread describing what you see, and how it formed. Stops are GPS-referenced for easy location. The book is lavishly illustrated with annotated photos and diagrams. A handy addition to the glove box of your car.
