

The Forest Products Commission (FPC) regards the provision of safe and healthy work conditions for the prevention of work related injury and ill health as its primary commitment to its staff and contractors.

The FPC's Fundamental Rules for Life and critical control behaviours must be adhered to at all times. Work must stop if it does not meet the required standard.

The FPC is committed to eliminating hazards and reducing work health and safety risks.

Under this policy, the FPC will:

- Comply with the Work Health and Safety Act 2020 and associated Regulations and fulfil legal and other requirements.
- Develop and maintain a work health and safety management system that includes continuous improvement and aligns with the International Standard ISO 45001.
- Develop measurable objectives and targets to ensure improved work health and safety performance.
- Allocate adequate resources to ensure effective management of hazards in the workplace.
- Develop an organisational culture with a high level of relevant health and safety awareness and training through communication, consultation and participation of staff and contractors.

- Clearly define responsibilities of staff and contractors to ensure accountability for work health and safety.
- Manage work related injuries to ensure early intervention and return to work at the earliest practicable time.
- Provide an employee assistance program (EAP) to support the wellbeing of staff and their families.
