Approvals Performance Report

The approvals data table shows that the Department achieved a consistently high level of performance across all key regulatory areas for the first quarter 2010.

Minerals Sector




Figure 1 | Mining Tenure Applications Number carried over to the next quarter

In relation to mining tenement applications, the data also shows that a reduction in the total number of pending applications is continuing at a steady pace (see Figure 1).

The substantial increases in exploration licence applications experienced over the course of the 2009 calendar year eased during this quarter. 798 applications were received compared to the peak of 960 in Q4 2009.

However, the number of applications for environmental approval to commence exploration activities (Programmes of Work) continued to increase during Q1 2010, and this trend appears likely to continue. The number of pending applications has also increased over the past year, from 145 leading into Q1 2009 to 243 at the end of Q1 2010. Resources have been reallocated to assist in meeting the increased demand.




Figure 2 | **Programmes of Work**

Figure 2 shows the number of applications for exploration environmental approvals received and processed since Q1 2009.

Petroleum and Geothermal Sector

For petroleum tenure applications, 97 per cent of those approved in Q1 2010 were processed within the Department's target timeframe, compared to an average of 80 per cent in 2009. In addition, the number of applications carried forward now stands at 137, a reduction from the total number of pending applications (160) at 1 January 2009.

Processing of petroleum environmental applications maintained their high level of compliance with the timeline target and also achieved a marked reduction in the number of pending applications since the beginning of 2009 (from 40 down to 18).

Approvals Performance Measures

The Department of Mines and Petroleum is continuing to implement improvements to its approvals tracking processes and reporting mechanisms. Initiatives include:

- an external review of its performance measures to provide assurance the measures being used were meaningful and
 consistent across the operating divisions, which has contributed to some modifications in the reporting format of the
 data table included in this report as well as further measures under consideration;
- a DMP systems development project working towards enabling the linking of all relevant applications assigned to particular projects across the agency (initially focusing on petroleum and geothermal projects); and
- ongoing work at an agency and whole-of-government level to allow mining and petroleum approvals to be tracked across government and provide additional data analysis.

To assist with the continual improvement of information provided, feedback from stakeholders or the public on the usefulness of this report is welcomed.

APPROVALS DATA TABLE - FIRST QUARTER 2010

The following table represents the number of applications received and processed by DMP for its key approval processes. For applications that completed the approvals process, an assessment of DMP's performance against timeline targets is also provided. The timeline target applies only to parts of the process completed by DMP and does not include, for example, the time taken for assessment by other government agencies or where the assessment process is put on hold while additional information is being sought from applicants.

It is acknowledged that the processes involved in completing approvals can vary widely in their complexity and scope. Nevertheless, for the sake of simplicity, all applications are compared with timelines within which it has been agreed that, with existing levels of assessing officers, the majority of applications can be completed.
